Chinchilla Show Societies General Rules and Regulations

1. All affiliated Queensland Shows are conducted subject to the rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies Inc., the constitution and rules of this Society and any other regulation, which appears within the schedule for individual sections of the affiliated show
2. Should there be any conflict between the rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies Inc. constitution and rules of the society and the regulations appearing in any schedule, the rules and regulations appearing in the schedule of this society shall prevail.
3. The President, Chief Steward and/or the Committee person in charge of any section shall have the right to alter or amend the program or the time of any event up to the commencement of judging.
4. An affiliated Society will not under any circumstances hold itself liable for any accident loss, damage or non-delivery of livestock or other exhibits at the Society's Show, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Affiliated Society blameless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising through accident, loss, non-delivery or damage whatsoever.
5. Exhibitors must obey all lawful orders of the President, Secretary, the Committee Person in charge or the Steward of the Section in which the exhibitor is entered. Failure to abide by any such order may incur a fine of an amount to be determined by the President of the Affiliated Society or on the order of the President, the exhibitor may be removed from the grounds together with the exhibitor.
6. Chief Stewards of an Affiliated Society shall have the power to remove exhibitors or other person from the vicinity of the Judge while judging. Preferably shows should close off areas while judging is taking place, and only the chief steward, judge and stewards should be present.
7. The judge's decision in any section at the affiliated show is final.
8. Ribbons/prizes will be awarded at the judge/s discretion notwithstanding that there may be provision in the schedule for awarding of the ribbons/prizes.
9. If, in the opinion of the committee person in charge or the chief steward of a section, any animal or exhibit is entered in the wrong class, the committee person or the steward in charge shall have the power to enter the animal or exhibit in its correct class prior to the commencement of judging that class.
10. Exhibitors shall at all times, behave in a proper and courteous manner to judges, show officials and other exhibitors. Should an exhibitor behave in an offensive or improper manner the committee person or chief steward in charge of the section shall have right to exclude and disqualify that exhibit from competing in the section.
11. A judge may not officiate, and compete or exhibit in the same section at the same show unless exceptional circumstances exist such as sickness or unavailability of the appointed judge.
12. An exhibitor shall not compete in a section if the exhibitor is a member of the judge's immediate family.
13. A judge or steward must not knowingly permit an ineligible exhibitor or exhibit to compete.
14. No exhibitor or members of the exhibitor's immediate family or employed by the exhibitor shall approach a judge with regard to a decision made by the judge unless they first obtain permission from the committee person in charge or steward of the section.
15. Any exhibitor, space holder or entertainer intending to bring electrical equipment into the affiliated show's showgrounds will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with earth leak circuit breakers and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected by a licensed electrical contractor and currently tagged by a licensed electrical contractor. This is essential for the safety of all exhibitors and the general public and is requirement of the current electrical safety regulations. The use of double adaptors is prohibited, and all power boards must be tested and tagged.
16. Dogs, other than those owned by the members of the canine control council, must be left in a closed float, a vehicle or on a short leash and must be suitably muzzled as to prevent it from being able to injure or bite any person or animal, whilst on the affiliated show society's showground.

17. Rules for individual sections at any affiliated society's show shall be as per the attached schedule and shall be read in conjunction with the rules.
18. A judge shall have no further information provided other than what is provided by the affiliated show societies.
19. In all Affiliated Agricultural shows sections, judges should not judge the same section within a 3year period at the same show.
20. Whilst all reasonable care is taken, the affiliated society cannot accept responsibility for any loss or damage or injury to or by livestock, exhibits, equipment, vehicles or any other property whilst it is on the affiliated show society's showground.
21. No exhibits are to be taken the pavilion from before 3:30pm Saturday 26th May or without the exhibitor checking with either the Chief Steward or the steward in charge at the time.

HORSE REGULATIONS

STABLES must be pre-booked prior to commencement of show via Global Entries. Bookings will not be kept without payment of \$10/stable/night or \$20/stable for the duration of the show. Powered camping sites are free to competitors only.

By entering the Show Grounds, all competitors and connections of competitors agree to abide by the following regulations:

1. DRESS – IMPORTANT - Full Riding attire must be worn in all Ridden Classes. Neat, appropriate attire may be worn in Led Classes. Riding Boots are to be worn in ALL ridden Classes.

Chinchilla Show Society is affiliated with Equestrian Queensland. **Approved Standard Safety Helmets MUST** be worn by all competitors riding a horse/pony on the show grounds [whether in the show ring or outside the ring] Approved helmets are AS/NZS 3838 [Current Australian Standard] or EN 1384 [Current European Standard] or ASTN F1163[Current US Standard]. Failure

to wear an approved helmet will result in **disqualification**. **Helmets ARE required for ALL ridden classes, including Stock Horse classes**, or other classes where a hat might normally be acceptable.

Junior [17 years and under] riders must wear **short jodhpur boots** [top boots are not allowed] in Junior Rider Classes. Handlers in led classes must wear appropriate, safe footwear. Any competitor not suitably attired will be excluded from competing in the event.

2. MEASURING: If the judge queries a horse's height and no official measurement card is able to be produced, then the horse will be measured on the day. The judge's decision is final on this matter.

3. A maiden is a horse who has never won a *first* prize in any similar event at any show.

4. A novice is a horse not having won a Champion Ribbon at an Agricultural show or a First at a Royal Show in a hack/hunter class.

5. An Intermediate is a horse not having won 1st, 2nd OR 3rd place at a Royal Show in a hack/hunter class.

6. Stallions are not permitted in Hack classes unless stated in the event. Stallions **are** permitted in Hunter and breed classes.

7. All Stallions and Colts must have a bit in their mouth whilst in hand. Stallions are not permitted to be ridden or handled by under 18 year olds. Stallions must display the green disc at all times.

8. Judge/Ring Steward/Chief Steward has the right to disqualify any exhibit, if such exhibit is not able to be sufficiently controlled in a safe manner for judging to continue. The exhibit will be ineligible to compete in the class in which it is entered.

9. AGE AND COMPETENCE OF COMPETITORS

a. Person who has not attained the age of 5 years must not ride a horse at a Show (unless otherwise stipulated for a particular Class). b. a Person who has not attained the age of 17 years must not ride or handle a stallion at a Show. c. Permission may be sought from the Chief Ring Steward for a rider less than 17 years of age to ride a stallion not exceeding 12.2 hands. This permission must be sought at least 24 hours prior to the Class and will be granted at the discretion of the Chief Ring Steward. d. The Chief Ring Steward may at any time require a Person who does not appear to be able to ride or handle any horse to dismount, allow other persons to handle the horse, or leave the ring. The age of a Person is determined as at the first day of the Show.

RIDING, HACK and SHOW HUNTER CLASSES – AGE RESTRICTIONS Show Pony Hack and Show Pony Hunter

Hack over 12.2 hands and not exceeding 14 hands may be ridden by a juvenile or adult. All small Show Pony Hacks and Show Hunter Pony Hacks 12.2 hands (127.5cm) and under to be ridden by a juvenile rider under 17 years of age. Horses may be entered in Hack classes OR Hunter Hack classes but **not in both**. This rule pertains to all classes including Breed Classes. Parents or assistants will not be permitted in the Ring during the judging of Children's Riding Classes, unless it is with the express request of the judge in that ring, in the interest of safety. Should any parent or assistant impart any tuition whatsoever or encouragement to a rider during the course of judging, the rider shall be immediately disqualified.

10. A Show Hunter is classified as a heavier horse with more substance than a modern fine hack. No coloured brow brands or coloured ribbons on rider. Show Hunters are not eligible to compete in Rings 1 and 2 on the Saturday of the Show (except for Rider, Pairs, Pleasure & Educated classes). YOU MUST CHOOSE TO COMPETE YOUR HORSE AS A HACK OR A HUNTER.

12. All horses & ponies in ridden classes must be 3yrs & over in age.

13. Children 4 yrs & under are ineligible to compete in the led classes.

14. All horses competing in **Breed Classes** must be registered or recorded with that respective breed society/association and registration papers must be produced upon request.

15. A district rider is one who has been a resident of post code areas 4413, 4412, 4411 and 4406 for at least three (3) months prior to the show. **A District Horse** is one that has been stabled or paddocked in post code areas 4413, 4412, 4411 and 4406 for at least three (3) months prior to the show.

16. Foals accompanying dams must be haltered and kept under control.

17. Competitors and all connections of competitors who fail to obey the orders of the Stewards will be rejected from the grounds.

18. No ring will be required to wait for a competitor in another ring, except in the case of Championships.

19. Only competitors who are competing in the ring events being judged at that time will be allowed in the ring.

20. Competitors or connections of competitors who approach the Judge without permission of a Steward will be disqualified for all events of the show.

21. Horse welfare issues, including Excessive use of whips or spurs by any rider will not be tolerated and will result in disqualification from the show No spurs with sharp rowels will be permitted.

22. Horse welfare is paramount, both in the ring or anywhere on the show grounds. Competitors found guilty of committing any act that is considered a horse welfare issue (physical or psychological) will be disqualified from taking part in all competitions at the show.

23. It is the responsibility of the Owner to ensure that the Cattle Tick requirements have been fulfilled. Showgrounds PIC: QICC0784
24. **NOMINATIONS RING EVENTS:** Nominations to be on line through **GLOBAL ENTRIES:** <http://globalentriesonline.com/event/10264>
25. **INDEMNITY AND HEALTH DECLARATION FORMS** must be handed in at the entry gate to the Chinchilla showgrounds. They are available on our web site.
26. A person must not administer a Prohibited Substance or cause/allow one to be administered to an exhibit who is competing at the show. EA/FEI Rules apply
27. **SWABBING** may occur at this event. By entering into any class, you accept that you are willing for a swab sample to be taken from your horse if chosen. In the event of a positive result, you will be required to pay for all costs associated with the test, and disciplinary action will be taken by Chinchilla Show Society. EA/FEI Rules apply
28. All competitors sustaining a fall or injury in the show ring **MUST** be viewed immediately by an ambulance officer before being allowed to carry on taking part in the show. Equestrian Australia Concussion Rules apply.
29. **Any Dispute** regarding ring events must be made in **writing and** accompanied with a **fee of \$50** to the Chief Ring Steward. **Disputes** must be **lodged prior** to the re-commencement of **judging**. Once judging commences, Disputes become null and void.
30. For matters not covered by these rules, refer to QCAS Rules and Regulations.

1. The Chinchilla Show Society Inc adopts the QCAS rules as part of their rules. These rules are the rules of our show.
2. NO BULLS OVER 48 MONTHS ARE PERMITTED TO BE SHOWN.
3. ALL SHOW CATTLE MUST BE TICK FREE TO ENTER THE SHOWGROUNDS.
4. All exhibits to be registered with a recognised Stud Beef Society. Registration certificates must be made available to Stewards if requested.
5. Dual Society Registered animals can only be shown in one breed.
6. All exhibits must be on the Showgrounds no later than 7.00 am Friday, 24th May, 2023. All cattle to be unloaded at ramps as directed by Stewards. **All vehicles are to be parked as directed by stewards.**
7. No stud beef cattle will be admitted to the grounds unless thoroughly tractable.
8. All cattle must be bona fide property of the Exhibitor for at least three (3) mths prior to the Show.
9. All ribboned exhibits must be led in the Grand Parade (if held). Failure to do so may lead to disqualification.

10. Whilst all reasonable care is taken, the Society cannot accept any responsibility for any losses of, or damage or injury to or by, any livestock, exhibits, equipment, vehicles or any other property.
11. All exhibitors who participate in the show ring MUST wear dust jackets or Society approved uniform at all times when their animal is presented to the judge.
12. Age of all cattle to be 1st May 2023.
13. All Bovine over 4mths must have nose grip or nose ring and all bulls **over 12 mths** must have nose ring.
14. A judge shall have no further information provided other than what is provided on the neck card of each entry by the Show Society.
15. The stewards shall have the power to redirect any beast to its correct class, BUT if the exhibitor objects the steward can then ask that animal in question and the person in charge to exit the judging ring.
16. Any person causing a nuisance by loud comments or the decision of the judges or otherwise unseemly behaviour will, after being cautioned, be expelled from the showgrounds and in the case of exhibitors, be liable for disqualification.
17. All exhibitors to have Public Liability Insurance and to have same endorsed for travelling to Shows.
18. **Any exhibitors/competitors intending to bring electrical equipment to the Showgrounds will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with residual current protection and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected by a licensed electrical contractor and currently tagged. The use of double adaptors is prohibited and all power boards must be tested and tagged.**
19. Risks identified by exhibitors/competitors will be eliminated or controlled by the exhibitor/competitor and particular attention will be paid to ensuring public safety and safety of other exhibitors/competitors.

A lovely light and airy traditional sponge cake

Cake to be baked in a **round 20cm** cake tin (approximate internal measurement)



INGREDIENTS:

1 ½ cups plain flour, ¾ cup cornflour, 1 ½ tsp baking powder, pinch salt, 6 egg whites, 190g butter, 1 ¼ cups white sugar, 1 tspn vanilla, ¾ cup milk, rose-pink food colouring.

METHOD:

Preheat oven to 150 degrees. Grease and flour 20cm round cake tin. Sift flour, cornflour, baking powder and salt three times. Beat egg whites until stiff peaks form. Cream butter and sugar with vanilla until pale and fluffy. Add half the milk, as it helps to dissolve the sugar. Add flours and fold to combine. Fold in egg whites and remaining milk until smooth. Don't worry if mixture curdles. Take a quarter of the mixture and add 2 or 3 drops of rose pink colouring. Place spoonful of white cake batter over base of cake tin. Place spoonful of pink batter in a circular pattern and cover with another layer of white batter. Fill the centre with pink batter then cover with remaining white batter. Smooth top and bake 65-70 minutes. Cake is cooked when it springs back to the touch and lifts away from pan when lightly shaken. Allow to cool on flat tea towel spread on newspaper. Ice when completely cold. Icing: Ice on top of cake only with pale pink icing.

METHOD: Prepare bar tin. Preheat oven to 180 degrees (160 degrees fan forced oven). Combine the dates, butter, sugar and water in saucepan. Stir over low heat until the sugar and butter have melted. Bring to boiling point and then remove from heat. Allow mixture to cool. Stir the sifted bicarbonate of soda, sifted flour, egg and nuts into the cooled date mixture. Spoon mixture into the greased tin. Bake in moderate oven for 40-50 minutes.

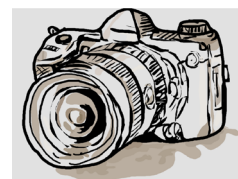

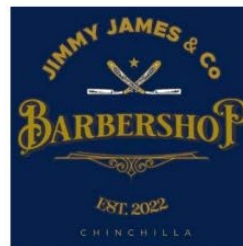

REGULATIONS

1. **ONE ARTWORK ONLY** from each student may be entered in the overall competition.
2. Awards will be given in four developmental phases **i.e.**
PHASE 1 (Pre-Prep, Prep)
PHASE 2 (Year 1/2)
PHASE 3 (Year 3/4)
PHASE 4 (Year 5/6)
3. **ANY TOPIC** for representation on the entry can be selected by the artist or at the school's discretion. Topics chosen for Curriculum purposes are acceptable.
4. Entries are produced *entirely* at school. Only exemptions are entries from distance education, home-school students or Pre-Prep entrants.
5. **ALL** works are limited to an A5 or A4 size.
6. **ONLY** paper from 80 gsm to 190 gsm is allowed.
7. **ONLY** light collage items will be accepted.
8. **NO BACKING** or **FRAMING** materials allowed.
9. **NO** adult's work, photocopies or tracings are allowed.
10. **ONE OFFICIAL ENTRY FORM ONLY.** This must be **STAPLED** in the top left hand corner on the **FRONT** of each entry, with child's name (EITHER FULL NAME OR FIRST NAME) written, **ENTRY CLASS** must be circled.
11. Student's full name, year and school (or distance education/home-schooling) to be written **on the back of artwork**
12. All entries must be submitted to the show office by 4:00pm **Friday 19th May 2023**, one week before the Show. **N.B. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.**
13. Any entries which **DO NOT FOLLOW REGULATIONS 3 TO 12 WILL BE DISALLOWED.**
14. When submitting entries please collate according to medium and class e.g. PAINTING Entry Class 1801.
15. Winning entries are displayed at the show. Other works displayed at discretion of Steward. Generally **ALL WORKS** are displayed.
16. Schools may collect students' entries and awards from the **SHOW OFFICE** on the Monday **AFTER** the show.
17. First, Seconded and Highly Commended awarded at the Judge's discretion.
18. Artworks are displayed at the entrant's own risk and at Steward's discretion.

Regulation:

1. Judging on Saturday, 27th May 2022 at 12 noon.
2. Competitors are permitted to enter the competition at any number of shows.
3. Only registered vehicle are eligible to enter the competition.
4. The President, Committee and/or Stewards reserve the right to reject and exhibit or exhibitor from competition.

CONDUCT OF COMPETITORS (DRIVERS/OWNERS)

6. Steward's directives must be followed.
7. Queensland Road Rules apply to competitors both inside and outside the venue.
8. Rules applying to the showgrounds must be observed at all times.
9. Speed must be limited as per Showground signage or as directed.
10. Vehicles are to be parked as directed and not moved unless directed by Stewards/Officials.
11. Intoxicated owners or drivers will be disqualified from the competition.
12. Excessive noise levels will not be permitted.
13. Competitors may undergo a breathalyser test. Refusal will mean immediate disqualification.
14. Any owner/driver behaving in a manner considered to be inappropriate will be disqualified.
15. Any person not abiding by any of the above rules will automatically be disqualified.
16. Any Registered vehicle that is classified as a UTE (tray back, well back, drop side or converted to a Ute) may be nominated by the owner and/or driver.
17. If converted to a Ute a Certificate of Inspection will be required.
18. The driver of the vehicle must have a current driver's licence.
19. All cash prizes and trophies must be claimed with in one month of the last day of the show. Trophies not claimed and prize money not collected by the date will be considered to have lapsed, and the amount will become a donation to the Show Society.

Class 1903 Best B & S Ute - Open to all makes and models.

The typical B & S Ball Ute showing evidence of Ball attendance, with Badges, Tickers, Aerials, Mudflaps, Rollbar, Bullbar and Spotlights. Overall interior and exterior presentation. Aerial flags are encouraged for display, but judging will be based on the vehicle itself.

Class 1906 2nd Chicks Ute

Class 1907 Best 4x4 Ute - Open to all makes and models.

Best representation of a 4 x 4 Ute, in constant use or part time 4 wheel drive. Additional four wheel drive accessories added to vehicle and including overall interior and exterior presentation.

Class 1908 2nd 4x4 Ute

Class 1909 Best Work Ute - Open to all makes and models.

Displaying Toolboxes and Trade accessories, and (where applicable) MUST exhibit clear Business or Trade signage on the vehicle. Overall interior and exterior presentation.

Class 1910 2nd Work Ute

Class 1911 Best Feral Ute - Open to all makes and models.

The real character Ute. Seen a lot of life, Bullbar, Stickers, Additional accessories, Antennas, reasonably neglected, unkempt and compete with dents. MUST be roadworthy.

Class 1913 Best Vintage Ute - Open to all makes and models.
